## MYANMAR INVESTMENT COMMISSION ISSUES CLASSIFICATION OF REGIONS BASED ON DEVELOPMENT LEVEL FOR GRANTING OF INCENTIVES

On 22 February 2017, Myanmar Investment Commission ("MIC") issues Notification 10/2017, classifying different townships in the different States and Regions into three zones based on development level.

The Myanmar Investment Law 2016 ("MIL") consolidating the previous foreign and citizen investment laws was enacted in October 2016. Among the new regulatory mechanisms included in the MIL is the granting of income tax exemptions based on the proposed location of the investment. The mechanism categorizes regions within Myanmar into three different zones: Zone (1) Less Developed Regions; Zone (2) Moderately Developed Regions; Zone (3) Developed Regions. The Notification 10/2017 describes which townships in each States and Regions are included in the three different zones. The summary of the three different zones and the townships included are as follows:

In accordance with MIL's Section 75 (a), investments in townships included in Zone (1), Zone (2) and Zone (3) are eligible for the following income tax exemptions:

Regions a	nd States	Years of Income Tax Holiday
Less Develop	ed (Zone 1)	Up to 7 consecutive years
Moderately (Zone 2)	Developed	Up to 5 consecutive years
Adequately (Zone 3)	Developed	Up to 3 consecutive years

It is noted that all of the townships in Yangon Region are included in either Zone (2): Moderately Developed Regions, or Zone (3): Developed Regions, thereby eligible for up to three consecutive years or up to five consecutive years of income tax exemption depending on the specific township where the investment is proposed to be situated. Investments in States like Rakhine State and Chin State are eligible for up to seven consecutive years of income tax exemption since they are classified as "Zone (1): Less Developed Regions." It is also noteworthy that not all sectors would necessarily qualify of the tax exemptions. In this regard, the Myanmar Investment Law's Section 75 (c) states that the income tax exemption would only be eligible for investments in sectors designated by the MIC as Promoted Sectors, which the MIC has yet to specify by notification.
